Former Education Minister

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Established on the 6th day of September 1979, Dera Natung Government College, with its erstwhile name "Government College, Itanagar", aimed at imparting higher education to young and inquisitive minds of the state at a point in time when the opportunity was scarce in the state. The founders had an ambitious endeavour not merely to make it a centre for offering degrees but also to let the youths explore new areas of knowledge, providing a platform for budding leadership in all walks of life, preparing the youths for future challenges in personal and social spheres and grooming them as competent human resources, who, in turn, would promote the high social ideals such as equality, social justice, communal harmony and cultural plurality and other vital objectives of this college.

The college began its journey on the premises of the Government Higher Secondary School, Itanagar, and fulfilled the educational aspirations of a few ambitious students with four departments, viz., English, Hindi, Economics and History, in the evening after regular school hours were over. In 1986, it was relocated to its present campus, which included a huge administrative and academic block. Following its relocation, the college operated with morning and evening shifts until 1990, when the evening shift was finally discontinued. Since then, the college has witnessed remarkable growth in infrastructure, student enrolment, faculty strength, academic performance, and research activities. The institution has also been accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore, for three consecutive cycles.

During its 45 years of glorious existence, the college community consisting of students, faculty members, non-teaching staff and the college authorities has been working towards the fulfilment of these ideals and goals, and presently it remains one of the premier institutes of higher education in the state with a legacy of excellence in teaching and learning processes. The college was rechristened as DERA NATUNG GOVERNMENT COLLEGE in the session 2001-02 to commemorate the remarkable contributions of the visionary and illustrious leader, the late Dera Natung, who served as one of the finest and most dynamic education ministers, striving for the all-round development of education in the state.

The college presently has 4631 students enrolled in three streams, viz., Arts, Science and Commerce, comprising 16 departments. There are 87 highly qualified and dedicated faculty members and 31 competent non-teaching staff working tirelessly for the growth of the institution. The college has a well-stocked library with more than 40000 titles, with a reading hall for students and designated chambers for the teachers. A large playground with an open stadium developed under the UGC fund provides ample facilities to students to nurture their skills in games and sports, athletic activities and other events, fostering physical fitness, mental well-being, and a vibrant campus life. An auditorium in the heart of the college serves as a venue for cultural, literary, academic, and indoor sporting events, as well as seminars, workshops, counselling sessions, and awareness programmes. The college has a Computer Centre and IT Cell which imparts free computer education on various courses. A fully digital language lab set up under the RUSA scheme helps the students sharpen their listening and speaking skills.

In addition, the Coaching for Entry into Services Cell offers guidance and coaching to APST students for various competitive examinations, particularly civil services and bank examinations. The Counselling Cell creates awareness regarding career opportunities, while the Remedial Coaching Centre supports economically and educationally disadvantaged students in improving their academic performance. Through its NCC wings and NSS units, the college also instils discipline, patriotism, leadership, and social responsibility among students, preparing them to serve society and the nation with confidence and dedication.

GENERAL INFORMATION

For the academic year 2026-27, admission to all UG programmes in Dera Natung Govt College, Itanagar, will be based on the Common University Entrance Test (Undergraduate) - 2026 [CUET(UG) – 2026].

1. CUET (UG)-2026 is conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). The candidate may note that the role of NTA is limited to the conduct of CUET (UG)-2026, declaration of results, and handling of queries related to the entrance examination. Simply appearing in CUET (UG)-2026 will **not** be a sufficient condition to secure a seat in the college.
2. Candidates seeking admission to any course/programme must apply only through the official online admission portal of the college - “**Online Admission - 2026**” provided in the college website (www.dngc.ac.in). Online Admission-2026 will serve as the single-window system for admission to all UG programmes of the college. Admissions granted outside the official online platform will not be considered valid.
4. The college shall have the sole authority to determine eligibility and verify documents for admission to any course/programme.
5. Before initiating the application process, the candidates are advised to read the prospectus carefully.
6. A percentage of the seats is allotted as open quota seats; the rest are reserved for candidates belonging to catchment areas. (page 6)
7. Selection into a specific programme (major subject) will be based on the preferences that candidates choose while filling in the application form and on the scores obtained in CUET (UG)-2026, subject to fulfilment of programme-specific eligibility criteria.
8. Candidates must appear in person for verification of original documents as and when notified by the university/college.
9. The college shall not be held responsible for any candidate’s lack of awareness of admission guidelines, schedules, eligibility criteria, or other rules issued by the state govt. from time to time. It is the sole responsibility of the candidates to stay updated by checking the college website regularly.
11. Non-compliance with the requirements of admission, including failure to submit necessary documents or non-payment of fees within the prescribed schedule, will result in cancellation of the candidate’s claim for admission.
14. If, at any stage, the documents submitted by a candidate for admission are found to be non-genuine, fake, fabricated, or otherwise defective, the candidate shall not be granted admission. If already admitted, it shall be cancelled without prior notice. If such discrepancies are detected after the completion of the programme, the degree awarded to the candidate shall be revoked, and appropriate legal action shall be initiated.
10. A candidate’s participation in the admission process shall remain provisional. If, at any stage, it is found that the candidate does not fulfil the prescribed eligibility criteria, the admission granted shall stand cancelled ipso facto, and appropriate legal action may be taken against the candidate. The college shall not refund the admission fee, if already paid, in such cases.
11. The College reserves the right to cancel the admission of any candidate found violating the rules and regulations laid down by the institution.
12. No request for online form fill-up, correction of subject combination, or admission consideration shall be entertained after the prescribed last date.
13. The Principal, Dera Natung Government College, Itanagar, reserves the right in all matters relating to admission.



GOOGLE WORKSPACE FOR EDUCATION INSTITUTIONAL EMAIL & DIGITAL RESOURCE POLICY

Dera Natung Government College provides institutional email accounts and digital services through Google Workspace for Education for academic and official purposes. The facility is intended to support teaching-learning activities, online classes, examinations, academic communication, research, and access to educational resources.

1. **Eligibility:** Institutional email accounts are issued to regular students admitted to the college, teaching and non-teaching staff and authorized institutional functionaries approved by the college authority.
2. **Ownership and Nature of Service:** All institutional email accounts, associated storage, and digital resources remain the exclusive property of the College and are administered under Google Workspace for Education. The account is provided only as a temporary academic facility and shall not be treated as a permanent personal email service.
3. **Validity:** Student accounts shall ordinarily remain active only during the period of enrolment in the college. Upon the completion of the course/programme, discontinuation of studies, transfer, expulsion, or prolonged inactivity, the college may suspend, archive, restrict, or permanently delete the account and associated data.
4. **Limited Digital Resources and Administrative Necessity:** The digital storage capacity, user licenses, and institutional resources available under Google Workspace for Education are limited. In order to ensure availability of institutional email facilities for currently enrolled students and authorized users, the college reserves the absolute right to periodically remove, deactivate, archive, or permanently delete accounts belonging to former students, inactive users, or users no longer associated with the college. Such action may be taken without individual notice where deemed administratively necessary. Former students shall have no claim, entitlement, or continuing right over institutional email accounts, stored data, or related digital services after the cessation of their association with the college.
5. **User Responsibility:** Students are advised not to use the institutional email for banking, personal financial services, permanent registrations, or non-academic personal purposes and to regularly back up important academic and personal data before completion of studies. The College shall not be responsible for any loss of data resulting from suspension, deletion, or deactivation of accounts.
6. **Prohibited Use:** Users shall not misuse institutional identity by circulating unlawful, offensive, defamatory or objectionable materials; engage in commercial or unauthorized activities; share passwords or allow unauthorized access; or use the service in violation of law, institutional rules, or cybersecurity norms. Violation may invite disciplinary action, including suspension or permanent termination of the account.
7. **Administrative Powers:** The college reserves the right to monitor usage for administrative and security purposes; reset passwords; restrict or suspend access; recover institutional data; and modify or discontinue digital services or policies as necessary.
8. **Acceptance of Policy:** Use of institutional email services shall constitute deemed acceptance of this policy and any amendments issued by the College from time to time.



ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1. Candidates who have passed the Class XII examination in the year 2026 from any recognised board, with English as one of the subjects, are eligible to apply.
2. Candidates who passed Class XII in 2025 may also be considered, subject to vacancy of seats and submission of a Gap Certificate from a competent authority declaring that the he/she was not admitted in any educational institution during the previous academic session.
3. Candidates seeking admission must apply through the official online admission portal of the college – "Online Admission-2026" provided in the college website (www.dngc.ac.in).
4. **Merit shall be based on CUET (UG) scores only.**
5. B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. 1st Semester has six compulsory course components:

Major Course (CC)	Minor Course (MC)
Multidisciplinary Course (MDC)	Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)
Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)	Value Added Course (VAC)

6. Among the six components, candidates must select major and minor courses while filling in the application form, based on the approved subject combinations. (page 18)
7. A major course is the core subject chosen by the student for specialization. A minor course is an additional subject to broaden the academic knowledge of the students.
8. AEC, SEC and VAC are compulsory components of the UG programme and will be allotted by the college as per RGU & NEP guidelines. Candidates are therefore not required to choose them.
9. Candidates need not select MDC courses at the time of admission. A separate notification regarding MDC course selection will be issued after the completion of the admission process.
10. Candidates must fulfil the programme-specific eligibility criteria provided.
11. **Under no circumstances shall a student be allowed to change his/her subject combination at a later stage.**
12. Candidates may submit multiple application forms with different combinations of their choice of Major and Minor courses. If selected in multiple applications, they may choose the subject combination of their preference.
13. Two seats each shall be reserved for NCC cadets and NSS volunteers on a merit basis. Candidates claiming such reservations must upload and produce the relevant certificates.
14. Two seats shall be reserved under the Sports Quota. Selection will be based on a combined assessment of CUET (UG)-2026 scores, performance tests, sports trials, practical tests, and/or relevant certificates.
15. Candidates claiming reservation under any category, including PwD and Orphan categories, must upload the necessary certificates/documents issued by the competent authority while filling in the application form.
16. Incomplete application forms are liable to be rejected.
17. Candidates must submit all required documents along with admission fees at the time of admission into the college. (page 10)
18. Original certificates of all the documents are to be produced at the time of admission for verification.
19. Failure to complete admission within the prescribed period shall lead to forfeiture of the claim for admission, and waitlisted candidates shall be considered.
20. Admission into hostels is subject to the hostel rules laid down in the prospectus. (page 12)
21. Submission of the application form or obtaining the prospectus does not guarantee admission to the college.

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME UNDER NEP-2020

The College is affiliated with Rajiv Gandhi University, which offers Undergraduate (UG) programmes in the Arts, Commerce, and Science streams under the New Curriculum and Credit Framework (NCCF) in accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. NEP-2020 provides a four-year UG programme with multiple entry and exit options. The following are the qualifications awarded under NEP on successful completion of each year of study:

1. A student who exits the programme after successful completion of the first year (Semesters I and II) shall be awarded an **Undergraduate Certificate**, provided that he/she completes a summer internship/apprenticeship.
2. A student who exits the programme after successful completion of the second year (Semesters I - IV) shall be awarded an **Undergraduate Diploma**, provided that he/she completes an internship.
3. A student who exits the programme after successful completion of the third year (Semesters I - VI) shall be awarded a **Bachelor's Degree**.
4. A student who exits the programme after successful completion of the fourth year (Semesters I - VIII) shall be awarded a **Bachelor's degree (Honours)** or **Bachelor's degree (Honours with research)**.

A student may choose the programme of a Bachelor's degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's degree (Honours with research) during the 8th Semester. However, only those students with a minimum CGPA of 7.5 (subject to RGU guidelines) can opt for a Bachelor's degree (Honours with research)

Multiple Entry and Exit: Students who exit the programme after obtaining an Undergraduate Certificate, Diploma, or Degree may re-enter the programme at the appropriate level and pursue the next higher qualification, provided that such re-entry takes place within three years from the year of exit.

The maximum duration allowed for completion of the Undergraduate Programme, including the award of any qualification under the Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit framework and period of exit included, shall be seven years from the year of first admission.

Apprenticeship and Internship

- Student has to go through Internship to exit after 2nd Year (4th Sem) with Diploma Course

Internship/Apprenticeship Opportunities for Students

Students may seek opportunities for an internship/Apprenticeship in the following broad areas:

- Opportunities to work with media organizations, artists, craftspeople, and other creative professionals.

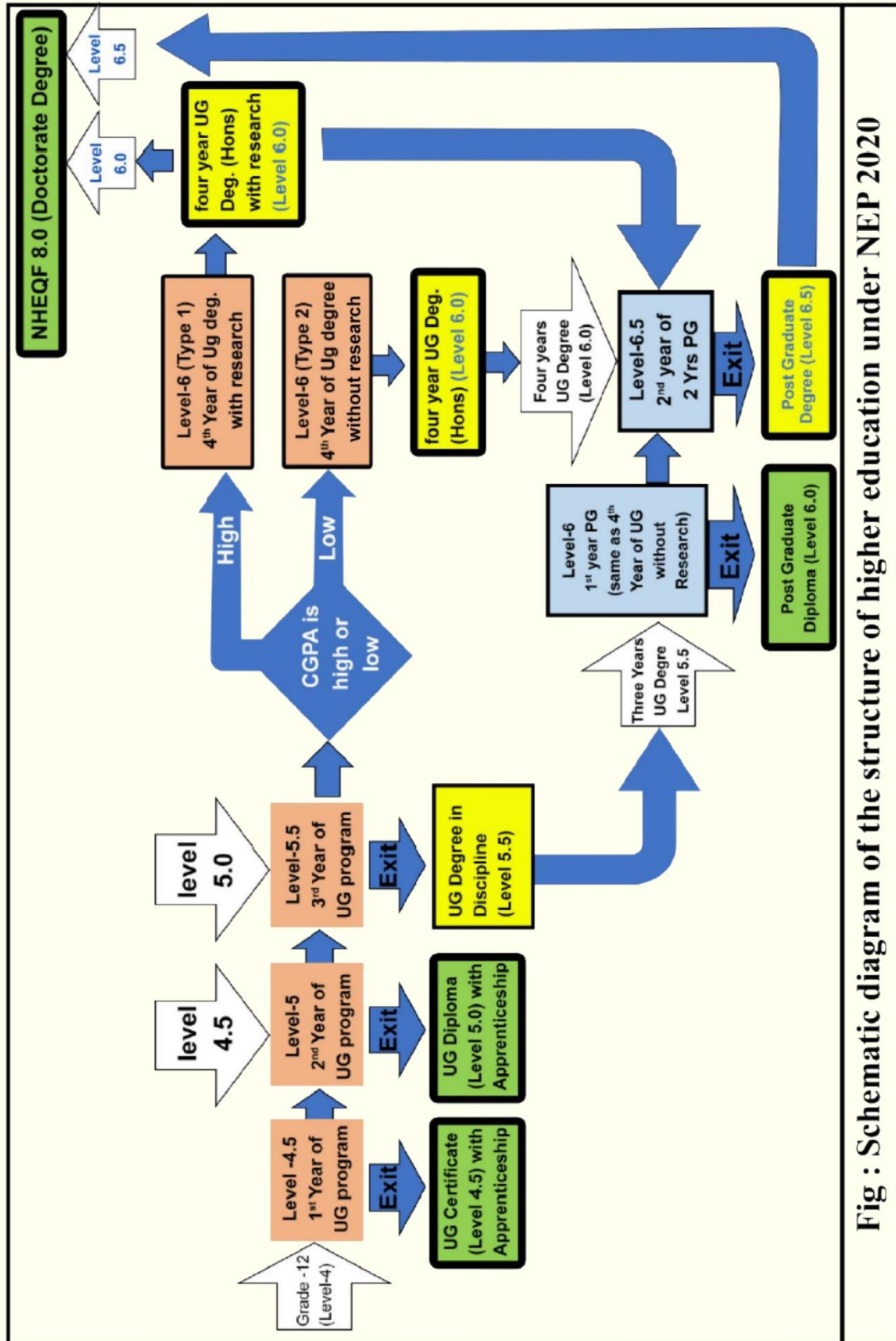


Fig : Schematic diagram of the structure of higher education under NEP 2020

EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

End-semester examination and related information under NEP 2020

- i. The new curriculum under NEP 2020, implemented by RGU from the session 2023-24 onwards is a four-year degree programme that offers degree with honours/ honours with research after the completion of four years, which is divided into eight semesters of 6 months' duration each.
- ii. The odd semester (I/III/V/VII) examinations are held in the month of November-December while the even semester (II/IV/VI/VIII) examinations are held during the month of May-June.
- iii. To fill in the examination form, the student must have adhered to the following norms:
 - a. **Internal assessment:** In every semester, there shall be **three** Sessional Tests (Internal Assessments) for 20% Marks; 80% Marks for the End-Semester examination in each paper. Out of the three internal assessments, the student must secure a minimum of 40% marks in at least two of the Internal Assessments individually.
 - b. **Attendance requirement:** The student must have attended a minimum of 75% of classes for each course to be eligible to fill up the university examination forms.
- iv. To pass the End-Semester Examinations, a student has to secure at least 35% marks in each paper and 40% marks in aggregate.
- v. A student shall be declared to have passed in the entire semester provided she/he has passed individually in all the papers in Sessional Tests, Practical Exams (wherever applicable) and End-Semester exams and then securing 40% marks in aggregate.
- vi. A candidate, who passes Semester exam or is 'promoted with back paper' to next higher semester, shall have to take formal admission for the next Semester by furnishing the Mark sheet of the preceding semester and depositing relevant fees within the notified Schedule/Timeline.
- vii. Such students, who are promoted to higher Semester, shall have to clear their back papers by appearing in the relevant end-semester examinations to be conducted in the subsequent year. He/she has to fill-up Examination forms for the back papers also, when conducted for the relevant Semester, along with the semester he/she is currently in.
- viii. A student who secured 60% and above is placed as first class, while those who secured between 40% and 60% is placed in second class.
- ix. The final result of the student shall be withheld till all the back papers are cleared by the student.
- x. Since the Semester system involves a continuous system of evaluation, there shall be no private or late college categories.



- xi. **Improvement Examination** – A student, after completing all semesters shall be allowed to take improvement examination. ONCE only within one year in not more than **two** theory papers of all semesters.
- xii. No improvement exam shall be allowed in the internal assessments or practical examinations.
- xiii. Under the current system, **re-evaluation** of the answer scripts is not allowed. However, a candidate may apply for **rechecking**.
- xiv. Admit Cards will be issued to the students in the preceeding week of the University Exams.

Scholarships and Merit Awards

The following stipends and scholarships may be availed by students during their course of study at the college, subject to the eligibility criteria prescribed by the concerned authorities.



Ishan Uday Scholarship: Students of the first/second semester (first year) domiciled in the North Eastern Region (NER), who have passed the Class XII or equivalent examination from a school situated within the NER through CBSE, ICSE, NIOS, or any recognised Board of Education in the NER, are eligible to apply for the Ishan Uday Scholarship.

Post-Matric Scholarship: Students belonging to eligible categories can avail themselves of the Post-Matric Scholarships. Post-Matric Scholarship under the Umbrella Scheme for Education of ST Children, Post-Matric Scholarship for SC students under the Department of Social Justice & Empowerment and Post-Matric Scholarship for OBC, EBC and DNT under Social Justice & Empowerment. Candidates belonging to states other than Arunachal Pradesh will be awarded scholarships by the state to which they belong and must submit the necessary documents to the competent authorities in that state. Students are advised to carefully read the eligibility conditions of the respective scheme before applying.

Arunachal Pradesh State Stipend Scheme: The Scheme, launched by the Government of Arunachal Pradesh (GoAP), provides monthly stipends and book grants to APST students to support the completion of their studies without financial hardship. Students belonging to the APST category are eligible to avail themselves of the stipend.

Labour Board Scholarship: The students can apply for scholarship of the Arunachal Pradesh Building & Other Construction Workers Welfare Board (APB&OCWWB). It offers Educational Financial Assistance to support the children of registered construction workers

General conditions for scholarships and stipends:

1. A student can avail only one government stipend or scholarship at a time.
2. Students must maintain a minimum of 75% attendance.
3. Applications for the schemes must be submitted online through the **National Scholarship Portal (NSP)** www.scholarships.gov.in within the stipulated time as notified by the competent authority from time to time and verified by the Institutional Nodal Officer (INO).

Principal's Merit Award: This award is given to the overall topper of the college every year on the basis of their performance in Semester VIII, as declared by RGU. The student who secures the highest marks in each stream in college gets the Principal's Merit Award, consisting of a cash award of Rs. 5000/- each along with a certificate.

Students' Academic Performance Credit (SAPC): Under this scheme, the admission fees of the individual toppers of Semesters I-VII of B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. are waived off at the time of admission to the next semester. The cost of admission is borne by the college authority. Total marks obtained in every semester are taken into consideration in order to determine the toppers in each semester. 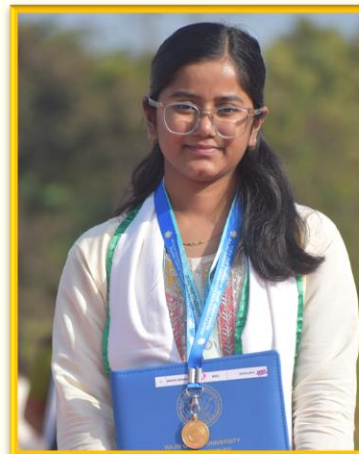
